# Medical Doctor/Provider



## Position Purpose:

- To ensure smooth delivery of health care and education to campers while supporting the clinic staff
- To ensure the health and safety of all campers
- To ensure an enjoyable experience for all campers
- To provide a meaningful and educational diabetes self-management environment for all campers
- To educate clinic staff, resident doctors, and other trainees on the management of diabetes.

## Roles & Responsibilities:

- Assist with camper check-in procedures, including health screening, medication review, and insulin dose adjustments upon arrival
- Prepare and administer medications to campers, volunteers, and clinic staff, ensuring all campers get their daily/nightly medications (as needed typically when the clinic staff is busy, for example, Tylenol, Motrin, or antibiotics.
- Provide first aid to campers, volunteers, and clinic staff
- Work with the Medical Team to provide 24-hour care to campers and volunteers, with rotating, on-call, and overnight coverage
- Collaborate with other medical professionals on the Medical Team to support and monitor the medical needs of campers and volunteers
- Review daily camper care charts and accident/incident forms
- Complete written reports and documentation (as necessary)
- Other duties as assigned
- Ability to collaborate with anyone with T1DM experience at camp including attendings, fellows, residents, NPs, PAs, nurses, clinic assistants, and the healthcare manager

## **Diabetes-Related Medical Tasks:**

- Administer and document insulin and other medications
- Assist with blood glucose checking (as necessary)
- Assist campers during episodes of hypoglycemia
- Document campers' blood glucose readings, insulin administration, insulin pump site changes, ketones, and hypoglycemia treatment
- Round on service and document the insulin/pump settings changes
- Adjust insulin pump basal rates and insulin ratio (carbohydrate and sensitivity) settings at check-in and throughout the session
- Assist with insulin pump and CGM site changes
- Assist with insulin pump troubleshooting

### Emergencies:

- Promptly respond and assist with camper and staff medical concerns or health emergencies including accidents, high and low blood sugars
- Treat or assist other medical staff with the treatment of moderate/severe hypoglycemia
- Administer mini-gluc, glucagon, and provide emergency care

### Provide Non-Diabetes Medical Care:

- Perform physical assessments throughout the day for camper and staff complaints or injuries (as needed)
- Write prescriptions throughout the day (as needed)

### **Requirements:**

- A current medical license to practice in the state of Ohio
- Type 1 diabetes experience (preferred)
- BLS certification (preferred)
- PALS certification (preferred)
- Pediatric experience (preferred)
- Physically and mentally able to provide medical care to children, teen campers, and camp staff with diabetes
- Strong communication skills
- Able to work independently and as part of a team
- Able to problem solve and ask for help when needed
- Able to accept guidance and supervision from others
- Able to relate to and interact with youth and adults in a positive manner
- Physical and mental ability to respond appropriately to emergency situations
- Able and comfortable communicating with campers, volunteers, and parents about any and all health and safety concerns
- Must complete the online application and submit proof of physical exam and copy of immunization records
- Complete paperwork for required reference and criminal background checks
- Ability to thrive in a camp setting and work irregular hours with daily exposure to the sun, heat, the outdoors, etc.
