Registered Nurse – Dayshift

Position Purpose:

- RNs are responsible for delivering health care and education to campers and staff
- To ensure the health and safety of all campers
- To provide a positive, enjoyable, supportive, and educational diabetes self-management learning environment for all campers

Essential Job Functions:

- Reside on camp property for the committed session
- Ensure the health and safety of all campers
- Work regular shifts in the clinic
- Participate in the general camp schedule of activities
- Work in collaboration with the medical and field staff

Nursing Tasks:

- Administer and document insulin and other medications
- Assist with blood glucose checking as necessary
- Assist campers during episodes of hypoglycemia
- Document campers' blood glucose readings, insulin administration, insulin pump site changes, ketones, and hypoglycemia treatment
- Ensure insulin pump basal rates and insulin ratio (carbohydrate and sensitivity) changed are inputted in the settings per Provider orders
- · Assist with insulin pump site changes
- · Assist with insulin pump troubleshooting
- Staff camper activities and provide medical support
- Promptly respond and assist with camper and staff medical concerns or health emergencies including accidents, and high and low blood sugars
- Treat or assist other medical staff with the treatment of moderate/severe hypoglycemia.
- Follow protocols outlined in the Medical Manual
- Follow staff policies and procedures
- Flexibility to go where needed
- Coordination with HCM and the Provider on-call for general health needs and troubleshooting BG trends
- Participation in camp activities as appropriate to enhance the camper experience
- Provide education as appropriate to campers and other staff
- Administer mini-gluc, glucagon, and provide emergency care
- Give an applicable report to night clinic staff
- Administer OTC and other medications as ordered
- Communicate with HCM any issues, needs, or incidents in a timely manner

Other Job Duties:

- Participate in pre-camp clinic training (Mandatory)
- Review camper physicals and paperwork for the assigned group prior to camper arrival
- Report all incidents and accidents immediately to the Healthcare Manager and Camp Director and cooperate in the completion of required follow-up/documentation
- Other duties as assigned by the Healthcare Manager, Medical Director, or Camp Director

- First Aid Experience

- Experience in both children and adult illness/injury care
- Desire to work with children and adolescents

- Ability to read and follow directions on medication labels, health forms, physician orders, and parent letters
- Ability to use a telephone
- Ability to communicate with parents, staff, and administration about camper health concerns
