

Job Title: Night Healthcare Specialist (Unlicensed)

Reports to: Night Healthcare Supervisor, Healthcare Clinic Supervisor, Healthcare Director

Schedule: One-week sessions available between June 14 – July 17, Sunday-Friday

Compensation: Starting at \$400/week. Includes all meals, room and board, referral bonuses, and the potential for a full-summer bonus equivalent to your earnings for a full week.

Qualifications: Must have a desire to work with children and adolescents. Experience with type 1 diabetes is preferred but not required.

Join our dedicated team as a Night Healthcare Specialist and help create an unforgettable summer for kids living with Type 1 diabetes. You'll provide essential medical support while fostering a safe, nurturing, and fun environment where campers can thrive. Often, camp is the only place a child feels safe and that they belong. You can provide that to a child and send them home with confidence, independence, and happiness. Your care and compassion will leave a lasting impact on these incredible kids, empowering them to embrace their uniqueness and build lifelong memories.

The Night Healthcare Specialists at Camp Ho Mita Koda are our Twilight Troopers and the unseen heroes of camp. They keep a close watch to make sure everyone is healthy throughout the night while helping prepare and restore the clinic to ensure another successful day of camp. The unlicensed Night Healthcare Specialists and Licensed Night Healthcare Supervisor work together as a team to monitor campers' glucose levels, conduct scheduled checks, respond to and treat low/high glucose levels, and provide all other medical care to campers and staff as needed. When not attending to campers, they are helping to clean and organize the clinic, restock supplies, and ensuring that everything is in place for the next day to start. Our night staff team allow us all to sleep soundly throughout the night knowing that campers are safe and being watched after.

We value flexibility and a collaborative spirit. While each role at Camp comes with primary responsibilities, there will be occasions when you'll be called upon to assist in other areas as needed. We believe in a 'can-do' attitude and appreciate staff members who are open to taking on new challenges. This approach helps us all grow and succeed together.

Duties and responsibilities:

- Be an active part of the medical team to ensure the health and safety of all campers and staff.
- Monitor glucose levels and trends of campers using the Dexcom Share in the clinic.
- Conduct glucose checks at 1:00 am and 4:00 am and treat campers accordingly.
- Respond to alerts and counselors' requests to check/treat a camper whose alarm has gone off.

- Assist campers with all diabetes management tasks such as checking glucose, administering hypoglycemia and hyperglycemia treatment, preparing and administering insulin under RN supervision, conducting pump-site changes, and other duties as assigned.
- Conduct pre- and post-meal bolusing (bedtime snack), including gathering carb counts, calculating insulin dosages, and administering insulin under RN supervision.
- Promptly respond to, treat, and/or assist with camper medical concerns or health emergencies including accidents, high and low blood glucose, illness, etc.
- Document accurate medical interventions in the EMR.
- Provide education to campers and staff about treatment, care, and management of type 1 diabetes.
- Offer emotional and psychological support to campers to help them feel comfortable, confident, and empowered in managing their type 1 diabetes.
- Follow a check-list of tasks to complete in the clinic each night including organizing, cleaning, etc.
- Follow all protocols outlined in the medical manual.
- Attend pre-season medical training.
- All other duties assigned by the Healthcare Director, Medical Director, or Camp Director.

Physical Aspects of the Job:

- Ability to walk through gravel and camp-like terrain.
- Ability to read and follow directions on medication labels, health forms, physician orders, and parent letters.
- Ability to communicate with parents, staff, and administration about camper health concerns.
- Possess endurance to meet emergency needs.
